

- One group member asked about info on representation for Latino candidates specifically. [This report](#) from FairVote breaks out many of its stats by individual racial or ethnic group, so this is a good one to glance through.
- One group member asked about the history of representation over time in RCV elections. [St. Paul, Minnesota](#) is the city I mentioned with an all-female city council. [FairVote Minnesota has great research](#) showing that RCV continues to get more popular in the years they've used it, plus additional demographic analysis on candidates. Other cities with trailblazing outcomes with RCV include [New York City](#) (adopted RCV in 2021), [Salt Lake City](#) (adopted RCV in 2021), and [Las Cruces NM](#) (adopted RCV in 2019).
- Miscellaneous other research: We maintain a page called [Research and Data on RCV in Practice](#) that compiles our own research and academic research from other sources, sorted by category like voter turnout, representation, campaign civility, etc. This might be a good overview of what's out there.
